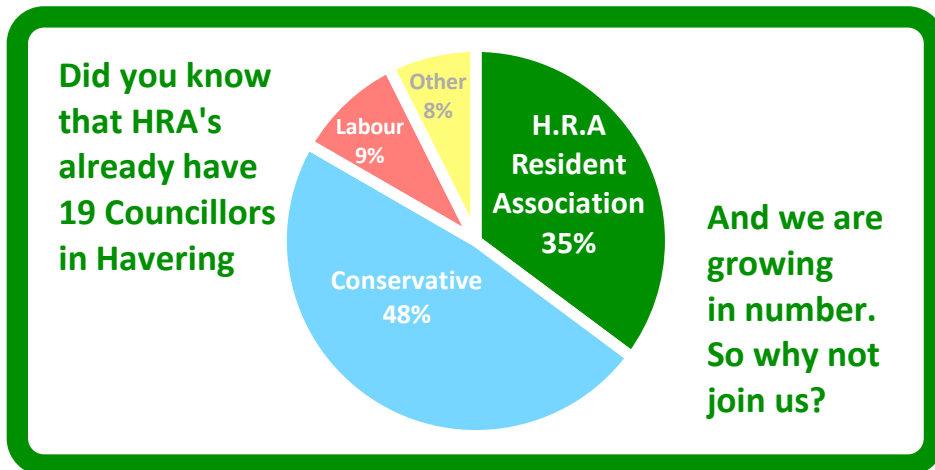

We are now seeing fewer shoppers on our high streets, as you now have to pay £1.50 just to pick up a prescription or a loaf of bread. Parents are having to pay £3.00 a day to drop children off at school.
